It also administers U.S. unilateral foreign policy export controls. In addition, this office is responsible for the industrial compliance provisions of arms control and disarmament treaties (e.g., Chemical Weapons Convention) and for representing U.S. industry and security interests in multilateral arms control and disarmament deliberations (e.g., Biological and Toxin Weapons Convention).

The NSTTC is responsible for issues related to national security export and re-export controls. It implements multilateral export controls for national security reasons to comply with the Wassenaar Arrangement,

This office is responsible for policy actions, export licenses, commodity classifications, license determinations, and advisory opinions for affected commodities and is the focal point for commodity jurisdiction assessments.
